## A Note From the Director

To all our friends and members of the Manresa family!



In spite of the reality of global warming, sitting here in Michigan this summer one would hardly imagine a crisis—temperatures have been unseasonably low and the weather exceptionally beautiful. One might also feel a bit more skeptical regarding the thesis that life in the United

States is speeding beyond our control—everything seems to be moving just a bit more slowly these days: people are taking more time to enjoy the beauty around them, going on vacations, and taking time for their families. Unfortunately, the economy is moving quite a bit more slowly these days as well. While I'm grateful for the cooler weather—air-conditioning costs are likely to be much lower—the economic slowdown has had, and will probably continue to have, a serious effect on our ability to make ends meet. Nevertheless, we remain optimistic—and with good reason: all of you!

## I've Been Reading

by Peter Fennesy, SJ

*Eastern Wisdom for Western Minds* by Victor M. Parachin. Orbis Books, 2007.

Just as God has providentially divided the human race into male and female so that each couple could have the benefit of two different points of view—stereovision of the world if you will—so also has our race been given oriental and western ways of thinking for a fuller understanding of reality, even of spiritual realities. This book consists of explanations of key eastern words and notions, listed in alphabetical order from Action to Zen, for the benefit of western-minded Christians. The explanations point out subtle differences we have in approaching things. I have found the entries enlightening and delightful, and you may too.

## A Moment in Manresa History

One little acre at Manresa's front gate has an origin different from the rest of our property. It is in another section of the first state survey. Levi Willard got the right to it in September, 1821. Levi, a tavern keeper, murdered his brother Abner in 1827, stabbing him with a butcher knife. He was sentenced to 2 years hard labor, but seems from official complaints to have been permitted to wander about more or less at liberty. Levi sold his rights to John Deming, who got full title to the property in January 1830, and sold it at once to the same Chesley Blake who bought the rest of our property. That little acre and the rest of Manresa have been united ever since. But even today they belong to two different municipalities. Manresa is mostly in Bloomfield Hills, but that one acre is in Bloomfield Township. When Fr. Dan Dunnigan collapsed in 2001, EMT teams and police units from both towns showed up and had to sort out which of them had jurisdiction and could convey him to the hospital. Bloomfield Hills won.

Those of you who associate with Jesuits in the Detroit area are undoubtedly aware that the Detroit, Chicago and Wisconsin provinces are gradually moving toward becoming a single province, which will stretch from the Idaho border to the Pennsylvania border. Jim has become associate pastor of Gesu Church, Detroit, a ministry he very much enjoys. And this fall the Jesuit novitiate just a few miles south of us will receive the novices from all three provinces. The Manresa Jesuits look forward to meeting these young men who one day will carry on the good work.

It is probably a sad commentary on our busy lives, but it seems we seldom take the time to recognize those who make significant contributions except during a moment of parting, and that is certainly the case with members of the staff. But during that moment we see clearly the dedication and loving, giving spirit which motivated them while they were with us and which we will miss. That occurred this spring when John and Kathy Daniels departed for Traverse City as John retired from UDM.

John and Kathy were an integral part of the Manresa family. Many of the photographs which dot our Web site and photo journals were captured by Kathy during her prayerful walks through the property. John's woodworking and computer skills have left a great legacy to us for years to come.
